

BPILA Board Meeting Minutes
June 10, 2008

BPILA memberships were reported as 65 members out of a possible 226. Membership drive was not held last year. All that's needed for membership is the amount paid and email address.

Fireworks will be in the same location. A print out of a collection form will be provided to all road reps. Tom will follow up with potential of getting sheriff's patrol to be on site on the 3rd. Scott will follow up with the fire chief to wet down the area for fireworks shoot off.

Dan Bailey is being recommended as BPILA representative to the Lake Improvement Board.

Next newsletter contents will include an article about what residents can do to help keep our lake healthy. The new Green's Landing store is interested in advertising in the newsletter.

Our permit for a goose roundup has expired. If we want to do another round up, we will need to have a petition drive to do so. We need at least 26 geese for a round up. Chris Nikodemski has cages. The roundup is done from south to north.

There is a discount with Herrington's for trash collection for BPILA members. The more people who use Herrington will impact the level of discount.

Frank Force provided an update on the fertilizer ordinance. The present ordinance only applies to commercial application. The sewer system is running fairly well. The township is weighing options of upgrading/redesigning or hooking up to another system. The trailer park at the north end of the lake is a big contributor to the sewer main. The trailer park ownership is paying for repairs and materials on previous damages. The DEQ has given a permit to discharge waste water in the old orchard.
