Sewer Update

From the Supervisor.....

Things have been happening with our sewer system this summer and fall and I would like to share the latest news with our sewer customers.

The township board is currently working with Sierra Consultants to reduce the annual costs of operating and maintaining our sewer system. Our overall costs have been creeping up the last two years and are on track to do so again this year. Sierra is receptive to this endeavor and is working with the township to get this done.

The township Clerk is also working with a telephone broker to reduce our telephone costs for the upcoming year. Telephone fees are a major issue since most of our sewer pump stations use telephone lines to communicate with our operators and emergency answering service.

The "Mission dialers" that were proposed to reduce the chances of overflows, like we experienced last winter, are now being installed after a lengthy wait due to financial considerations and some parts that had to be backordered and were slow in coming. This capability dramatically reduces the need to inspect these stations on a weekly basis which is the case for the old land line phones that are in the remaining 17 major stations. The MDEQ (Michigan Dept. of Environmental Quality) is currently reviewing the townships application for the renewal of the discharge permit for the Grattan/Vergennes irrigation site. As a condition of this approval they are requiring the township to do a series of soil borings at the irrigation site to determine if high levels of sodium and chloride have permeated the clay sub-layer and may be affecting the deep water aquifer that supplies surrounding wells. The cost of doing these soil borings will be in the neighborhood of \$20,000.

Along with some limited engineering help, I sor@grattantownship.org am currently attempting to reduce these requirements or to eliminate them altogether by arguing that the monitoring well showing the high concentrations of Sodium and Chloride is not representative of the deep water aquifer. I have a request for all of the sewer customers and especially those living on Big Pine Island Lake. As these residents are painfully aware, Big Pine Island is subject to numerous power outages that are unpredictable and quite often short-lived and may affect only portions of the lake.

When these power outages occur, the pump stations do not operate to remove wastewater from homes and move it down the line to the next pump station. During extended power outages, many residents use generators to run their wells and consequently pump water into the system that the pumps cannot remove. This water fills the pump stations and could cause overflows if not attended to promptly.

Even during short outages the pump stations will not return to service since the three phase power has to be reset manually after a power outage. Our operations people are not always aware when these isolated short-term outages occur and a timely phone call could save us from an overflow.

I am currently working with Consumers in an attempt to explain why Big Pine Island seems to be plagued with mini-power outages. Very little progress so far.

What I am asking of the sewer customers is that they call the emergency phone number whenever they experience a power outage. This call will alert our operators that some pump stations need attention promptly.

From the Assessor.....

Understanding that the housing market is declining and taxes seem to be increasing, I thought that we should try to make sense out of what is happening with the property taxes for 2009. In 1994 Michigan voters approved the constitutional amendment known as Proposal A. Prior From the Desk of the Fire Chief... to Proposal A, property taxes were based upon State Equalized Value (SEV). With the implementation of Proposal A, property taxes are now based upon Taxable Value.

Each year, the Assessing Office must calculate the SEV for every property based upon the time frame as outlined by the State Tax Commission. A property's taxable status is determined as of December 31, which is called Tax Day.

Capped Value is calculated by multiplying the prior year's Taxable Value, with adjustments for additions and losses, by the CPI as calculated by the State of Michigan and cannot increase more than 5%. For 2009, the CPI has been calculated at 4.4%.

Taxable Value (TV), which property taxes are based on, is defined as the lower of State Equalized Value or Capped Value.

current year SEV is less than the previous year Taxable Value multiplied by the CPI, the current year Taxable Value will increase by the CPI.


